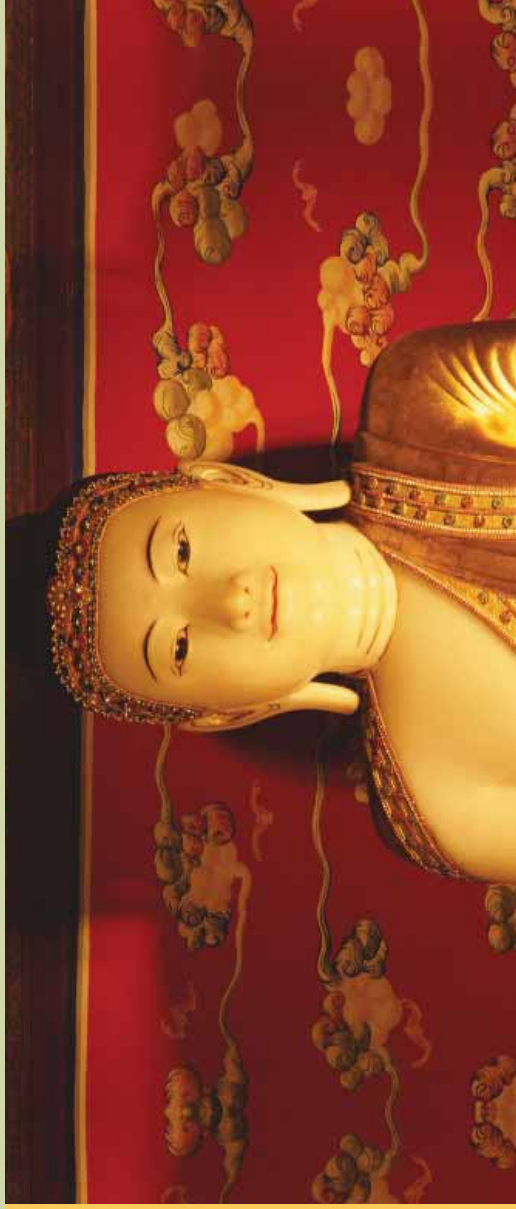

A signed, valid passport is required for each person and we suggest that if you do not already have your passport that you apply for it immediately. If you currently have a valid passport, it must be valid a minimum of 7 months after your scheduled date of return to meet the requirements for your visa. A passport, completed visa application form and passport size photo must be submitted to GN, 75 days prior to departure. An individual visa can be obtained by GN only for those passengers paid in full 75 days prior to departure. Reservations received less than 75 days prior to departure will need to obtain their own visas.

NOTICES: Any complaints or claims against GN must be made in writing and received by GN within 90 days after scheduled termination of the trip. Any action or suit against GN must be commenced within 1 (one) year after scheduled termination of the trip or be forever barred.

DAY 1 U.S.A./BEIJING. Depart for Beijing today. Cross the International Date Line and lose one calendar day.

DAY 6 XI'AN/CHONGQING. Take an unforgettable excursion to the tomb of the First Emperor of China and revel at the remarkable discoveries that have been buried for many centuries. Visit the archaeological site to view more than 1,000 of the 7,000 life-sized and uniquely detailed figures of the Terracotta Warriors and their horses. 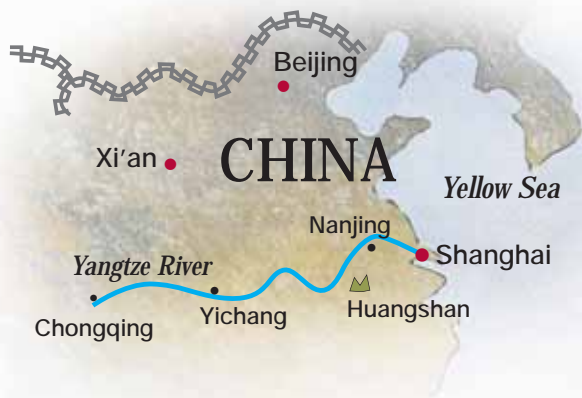
